

Navarro County 4-H Bronze Star Guidelines

The Bronze Star Award is designed to recognize the outstanding achievements by 4-H members who are 9 years old as of August 31 or in the third grade, to age 10 years old. The member must have been in 4-H for at least one year. The 4-H member must submit a 4-H Record book and complete a Navarro County Star application. Three awards will be presented annually, and a 4-H member may only receive this award once.

Criteria for Selection:

1. Must be 9 years old by August 31, or in third grade, to 10 years old as of August 31.
2. Must have been in 4-H for at least 1 year.
3. The Bronze Star Award will be presented to the most deserving junior member without regard to gender.
4. The 4-H member must submit a 4-H Record Book in the year he or she is to be considered for the Bronze Star Award.
5. The 4-H member must have completed two different project areas during their 4-H career.
6. Must have participated in various 4-H activities, community service and leadership experiences.

Judging Procedures:

- a check of award eligibility and required application materials
- judging of the awards application
- an interview with a panel of judges
- review of 4-H record book and achievements

Navarro County 4-H Silver Star Award Guidelines

The Silver Star Award is designed to recognize the outstanding achievements by 4-H members who are 11 - 13 years old as of August 31. The member must have been in 4-H for at least two years. The 4-H member must submit a 4-H Awards Program Record book and complete a Navarro County Star application. Three awards will be presented annually, and a 4-H member may only receive this award once.

Criteria for Selection:

1. Must be 11 - 13 years old as of August 31.
2. Must have been in 4-H for at least 2 years.
3. The Silver Star Award will be presented to the most deserving intermediate member without regard to gender.
4. The 4-H member must submit a 4-H Record Book in the year he or she is to be considered for the Silver Star Award.
5. The 4-H member must have completed four different project areas during their 4-H career.
